

## **The Cardiocerebral Vascular Prevention and Management Law(C-V Management Law) and Patient registration.**

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### Background

C-V Management Law enacted in May, 2016, the aims of Law are to make the policy and implement for prevention, comprehensive care, rehabilitation and research for cerebrovascular.

### Results and Discussion

The act 6 of C-V Management Law explains registration statistics. the Minister of Health and Welfare project might to implement the surveillance and registration system to develop the incidence, recurrence, mortality data of cerebrovascular diseases. The data on the risk factors, onset, treatment, and rehabilitation, are be collected and analyzed continuously, systematically.

The medical institution, National Health Insurance Corp., and HIRA should cooperate to submit of data and opinoins on the cerebral vascular disease registration statistics.

the purpose of registry statistics should be explicit and specific. The system for data generation, collection analysis, distribution, and utilization should be developed and planned. The role of the medical institution and academy should be explained and included.

There are some registries about the cardiovascular diseases. however, I would like to focus on the 2 registries of them. One is the KAMIR registry. The Korean Society of Cardiology developed the KAMIR registry and the produce the important statistics however, mainly used the clinical researches. The other registries, which is under the development now, the Cardiac Registry of Reginal C-V Centers(RCVC). RCVC Registry aims to produce the data for the evidence-base health policy. According the stages of pre-hospital, In-hospital, post-hospital, the focuses are on identifying the preventable, correctable factors and procedures

### Conclusion :

To produce the reliable, representative data are very important, on which national health policy should be based. Collaboration starategy should be developed among academic society, hospitals, Reginal C-V Centers(RCVC), NHIC, HIRA, and CDC.
